**OPPORTUNITY TO DEVELOP EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS FOR A COUNTY-WIDE DAY OF ACTION CELEBRATING:**

**Norfolk's history as place of sanctuary**

**We are looking for educators interested in joining our research team, or working alongside them, to develop lesson plans and educational materials for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 which explore Norfolk's rich history as a place of sanctuary.**

Norwich Schools of Sanctuary, Anglia Ruskin University, The Common Lot and Amnesty International are collaborating to organise a day of action in schools across Norfolk on Friday 20th April 2018. Norfolk Welcomes will kick off the Amnesty International *Football Welcomes* weekend.

*Norfolk Welcomes* will see schools across the county deliver assemblies and lessons to raise awareness of the experiences of displaced people such and to connect pupils with Norfolk's rich history as a place of sanctuary and refuge.

For the day of action, a team of citizen researchers will work alongside educators to conduct new research, and to develop educational resources for primary and secondary schools.

The research will centre on three themes:

- **Canaries, books and beer:** the legacy of the Strangers (16th century Dutch and Flemish refugees)
- **Norwich's history as a city of sanctuary:** an examination of different waves of refugee migration over the centuries
- **The Canaries & Tony Gallego:** Norwich City FC's links to local refugee history (Spanish Civil War)

## **Process**

The project has a relatively tight deadline and will require some commitment by participating educators.

*The project will be broken into 2 stages:*

### **Stage 1: Dec-January 2018**

- *Attend a group meeting to learn more about the project. If you are interested you will be assigned to 1 of 3 specific areas of Norfolk migration history.*
- *Access the shared research on google drive and become familiarised with your historical area*

### **Stage 2: Feb-April 2018**

- *Attend a workshop in late February at which:*
  - *The research team will share their findings*
  - *Ideas for resources and lessons plans will be developed*
- *Produce a lesson plan or lesson plans for your historical area (end of March)*

### **Commitment:**

- *Attend a large group meeting for citizen researchers and educators ( December)*
- *Work with researchers at a workshop to develop lesson plans (February)*
- *Work independently to create a lesson plan/plans (end of March)*

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We will have a meeting at the **Garnett Wolseley (Norwich Market Place)**, from **7.30-9.30 on Wednesday, 6<sup>th</sup> December**, where we will:

- Introduce the project
- Discuss research areas and teams
- Discuss research strategy
- Have a drink and share our ideas about this exciting new project.
