### Summer Uniform

As the weather (hopefully) warms up, children may wish to wear summer clothing. The following uniform may be worn:

Sensible sandals may be worn but parents need to bear in mind potential for injuries with open-toed shoes.

Please note, we ask that children do not wear 'croc' type shoes.

### Behaviour outside of school

It's wonderful that the weather has started to improve and that the evenings stay lighter for longer! This also means that children from school are likely to spend more time playing outside with their friends including at Heigham Park.

There have been some isolated reports of poor behaviour at the park and I would appreciate your support in preventing this by talking with your children about your expectations of their behaviour outside of school. Thank you.

If you have a concern...

From time to time, you may have a concern regarding your child at school. Please don't hesitate to contact your child's class teacher in the first instance. If you wish to speak to somebody else, you could ask to speak to your child's Year Leader. Of course, you can always contact either myself or the Assistant Headteachers, Mr Chambers and Mrs Baber, if you are still worried. Remember, I am outside on the gate each morning and usually available for a quick chat at that time.

### Going Home Arrangements

Please ensure that children know who is collecting them at the end of each day. They should also know if they are being expected to walk home alone or with friends. There have been instances where children have not been clear about the arrangements and this has delayed them in going home and caused extra work for the office staff as well as causing upset for the children.

Whilst we understand that sometimes last minute changes to arrangements need to be made, please avoid this wherever possible.

### ParentMail

Please remember that ParentMail is available for payment of all school related items, including music lessons, lunches and trips.

We appreciate your prompt attention to any outstanding items.

### Nuts and treats

**Just a reminder that absolutely no nuts are allowed in school. Please check this carefully on packaging of items sent in with lunches. We also don't allow for treats to be shared with the children for birthdays as this can be difficult for children with allergies and may not be in line with the wishes of all parents.**
