- how maps can show us where and why Ancient civilisations settled.

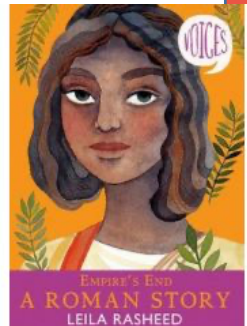
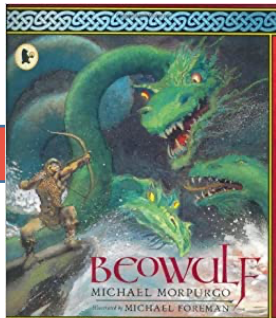
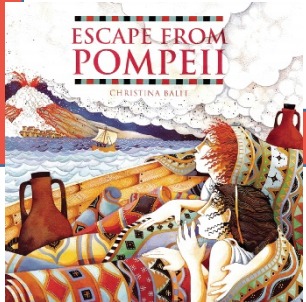
Art
