Mr Bunting's federation update

The first days as Executive Headteacher of our Federation have been a whirlwind, but an exciting one! It's been a pleasure to build relationships with children, staff, parents and carers who are new to me and to get reacquainted with some I'm seeing for the first time in a different environment.

An important goal for our federation this year is to bring the school communities closer together. We have already begun to address this by mixing staff for part of this year's first Learning and Development Day. This will be the first of several federation joint ventures this year, some of which will involve parents and children. Please keep an eye on future newsletters for more information.

This term's main federation improvement focus will be writing. We know that the pandemic has significantly affected writing confidence and outcomes, so the "federation family" will work together to address this. We will seek the views and ideas of parents, along with the children, to ensure that we all work together as one to improve the learning.

Communication between home and school

Good communication between school and home is essential for the wellbeing and good progress of every child. At Avenues we use the following methods for communication. Staff may not respond after 5pm:

Class Dojo: This is a quick and easy way to contact your child's teacher and for them to contact you.

Email: Please email the office and mark the email 'For the Attention of...' to request a meeting or call from staff. You can also email the office to report a child absence.

Telephone: Call the office if you need to speak to someone to make sure that a message gets passed on. Please also use the office phone number to report child absences.

Speak directly to us: Members of the Senior Leadership Team and the pastoral team are out on the playground each morning and class teachers are on the playground at the end of the day.

Please note: We ask our staff to answer messages as soon as possible and within the hours of 8am and 5pm wherever possible.

A couple of reminders...

We are a kiwi and nut free school. This means that your child must not bring items containing either kiwi or nuts into school. This is to protect some of our children who have severe allergies.

Whilst crisps are allowed in lunchboxes as part of a balanced lunch, they are not allowed to be eaten at break time for a snack. We encourage your child to have a healthy snack at break time.

Clubs

We always offer a broad range of after school clubs and extra curricular opportunities. These tend to change each year dependent on staff interests and current trends.

We are still in the process of finalising our clubs list for this year. Information about these clubs and how you child can join will be shared with children and families in the near future.

Is your child entitled to free school meals?

If you receive one of the following then your child may be eligible: Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, The guaranteed element of Pension Credit, Working Tax Credit run-on or Child Tax Credit

Please do apply if you are eligible. As well as your child receiving free school meals, the school receives additional funding for each pupil identified. Further information can be found here: https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/education-and-learning/schools/school-meals-and-milk

If your child is eligible for free school meals then you may also be able to access a fully-funded place at the school's Before School Club run by Set Your Sights. The school pays for several children to attend this provision for a range of reasons including in order to support care givers who work. Hallswood Animal Sanctuary

We did some fantastic work last year, collecting a wide range of materials which could be recycled through the Terracycle process. The money raised from this helped to support the Hallswood Animal Sanctuary, who do an amazing job taking in injured and sick animals and rehabilitating them. This year we intend to continue with our efforts to recycle and support charity!

Within each of the classrooms, we have designated recycling boxes to collect old pens and empty crisp packets.

Please try to remind your children to put their wrappers in these boxes—we will be doing so at school too!

As a school we have rehomed families of hedgehogs and squirrels from our school playground to Hallswood Animal Sanctuary.
