#### No Nuts or Kiwis

This is a polite reminder that we are a nut and kiwi free school. This includes peanuts. Its really important to check the ingredients of snacks to check they do not contain nuts. We found the snack wrappers pictured above in our recycling—they both contain nuts. Please be vigilant about this as nuts can cause severe reaction in some children which can lead to anaphylaxis. This can be fatal.

## Anti Bullying Week—Odd Socks Day

On Monday 13th November, children and staff are invited to wear odd socks to help get into the spirit of anti-bullying week and celebrate our unique differences. The theme this year is 'Make a noise about bullying.' This theme is designed to empower everyone to do something positive to counter the harm and upset that bullying causes.

We do not tolerate bullying at Avenues and so if you feel your child is being bullied or are worried about any pupil, please contact your child's teacher.

### Attendance

Our current attendance is 95.9%. Before the pandemic, attendance was regularly at 97%.

We recognise that children may also experience worry and mild or moderate anxiety, and that, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a normal part of growing up for many children and young people. In such cases, we recommend bring your child to school where, in the vast majority of cases, their worries and anxiety and be supported, whereas prolonged absence from school can have a negative effect.

We are here to help so please do speak with Lauren Gislam, our Family Engagement Officer, Susanna Manrique or Mike Hooper, Head of School if you have an attendance worries.

Please note, holidays in term time will not be authorised. School is only able to authorise absence in exceptional circumstances.

## Is your child entitled to free school meals?

If you receive one of the following then your child may be eligible: Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, The guaranteed element of Pension Credit, Working Tax Credit run-on or Child Tax Credit

Please do apply if you are eligible. As well as your child receiving free school meals, the school receives additional funding for each pupil identified. Further information can be found here: <u>https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/education-and-learning/schools/school-meals-and-milk</u>

If your child is eligible for free school meals then you may also be able to access a fully-funded place at the school's Before School Breakfast Club run by Set Your Sights. ### **Parent Volunteers**

We know that parents/carers and other members of our community have a huge range of skills, interests and professions! If you would like to share some of these with your child's class or across the school, please don't hesitate to get in contact with your child's teacher.

Volunteers would have some initial safeguarding training before starting.

#### **Driving Around School and Parking**

We encourage as many of you as possible to cycle or walk to school. If you need to drive, please keep the crossing on Avenue Road clear and do not park on the zig-zag lines.

It would help to make the surrounding area much safer for children if you could park a short distance from school and walk the remainder of the journey.

Parking is obviously very difficult around school and there have been a number of cars seen to mount the pavement whilst the paths are busy with pedestrians, including our children. We ask that you avoid mounting the path to help make it safer for pupils,

We really appreciate your cooperation with this.

## **Staffing Update:**

We wish to congratulate Ms. Cole who has been appointed as pastoral assistant. Ms. Cole has worked with us both in the office, as an MSA and supporting in class and so knows the children well.
