What we're watching to inspire our storytelling: Holes is a 2003 American comedy drama film directed by Andrew Davis and written by Louis Sachar, based on his 1998 novel of the same name.

Important people or places:
Most of our class book takes place on Green Lake, in Texas. This fictional place is described as it was in the late 19th and late 20th centuries. There are also brief flashbacks to scenes in Latvia in the mid to late 19th century.

As Historians, we will be learning how to use key historical language to describe a person's life. Drawing on our emotional literacy, we will be exploring the feelings, thoughts and actions of people in history. As part of this work, we will be learning about the Bristol Bus Boycott. As historical writers, we will then apply to our skills to writing an engaging, informative biography of a female trailblazer of our choice.

As Artists, We will be using printing to create a city scape (artistic representation) of the physical aspects of Houston (to tie into our comparing and contrasting Norfolk and Texas unit in geography).



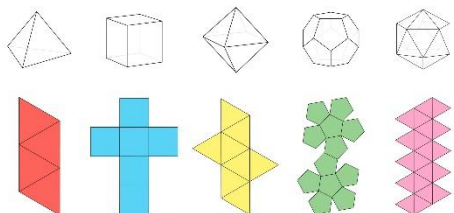

Industry	Industry is any economic activity which creates jobs and generates income.

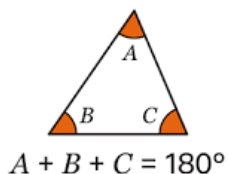

Interior angles in a triangle

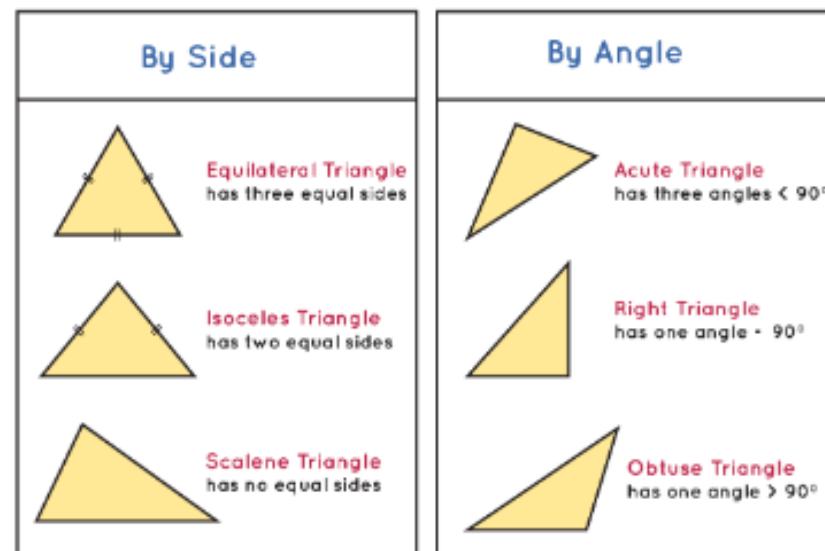
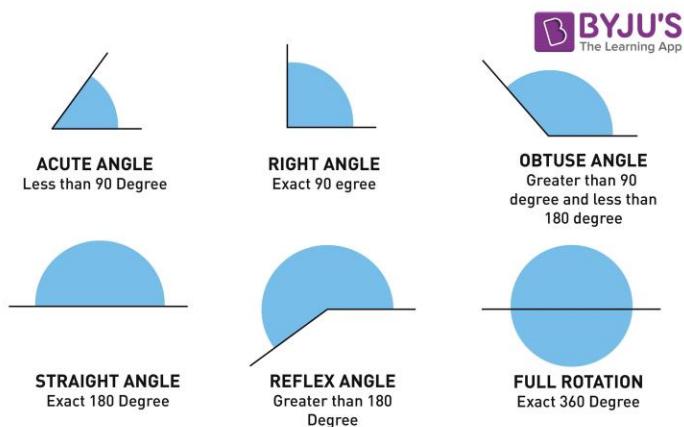


Science, Technology, Engineering and mathematics (STEM):

As Scientists, we will learn to use the recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram. We will compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches.

STEM Vocabulary	Definition
Net	The net of a 3D shape is what it looks like if it is opened out flat. A net can be folded up to make a 3D shape.
Circuit	An electrical circuit is a complete path which electrical energy can flow through.
Component	An electrical component is the general term for any part of an electric circuit. This includes (but isn't limited to): wires. switches. resistors.
Current	An electrical current is the steady flow of electrons. This is measured in amperes (amps).

STEM vocabulary recap from year 4 and 5:
